

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## **1** About these instructions



This instruction booklet is just part of the documentation for the FGE280B floor grinder. This booklet is only complete together with the "Floor grinding safety manual".

This booklet together with the "Floor grinding safety manual" is part of the equipment. It describes safe and correct use in all operating phases.

- Carefully read the instructions, especially the safety information, before use.
- Keep the instructions throughout the lifetime of the equipment.
- Keep the instructions accessible to the operator and service technician at all times.
- Always pass on instructions to all future owners or users of the equipment.
- Update the instructions whenever you receive an update from the manufacturer.

## 2. Safety



#### INFORMATION

Grinding machines may only be used by authorised personnel. You can find information on authorised personal in the "Floor grinding safety manual".

### 2.1 Protection devices and signs on the equipment

### 2.1.1 Protection devices

Protection devices may only be removed when the equipment is switched off, has been disconnected from the mains supply and is stationary. Safety components, in particular, may only be removed and re-installed by authorised persons.

Safety elements must be checked to ensure they are in perfect working order before the equipment is brought back into operation.

### 2.1.2 Signs on the equipment


- 1 Wear protective boots

Personal protective equipment (PPE)


## 2.2 Spare parts and modifications

Only use genuine spare parts from TYROLIT. Otherwise, personal injury, damage to the equipment and other material damages can occur. Do not install attachments on or convert the equipment without TYROLIT's written consent.

## 2.3 Danger zone and work area

### 2.3.1 Floor grinder danger zone

The area marked in the drawing shows the danger zone around the floor grinder. No part of the body may be inside this area while the floor grinder is running.

### 2.4 Residual risks

There is a risk of severe injury resulting from the residual risks described below.

#### 2.4.1 Grinding tools flying away

- Only start grinding when there are no other persons in the danger zone.
- Make sure that a safety distance is complied with.
- If grinding tools are damaged, change them.
- Grinding without a protection cover is prohibited.

#### 2.4.2 Uncontrolled movements and vibrations

Do not connect or disconnect cables when the floor grinder is running.

#### 2.4.3 Getting trapped and caught

Items of clothing or long hair could be caught by the rotating cutting tool.

- Do not wear loose clothing when working.
- Secure long hair in a hair net.

#### 2.4.4 Harmful dust

Inhaling dust can lead to respiratory problems.

Inhaling dust emanating from the machine is hazardous to health.

- Wear a respirator mask.
- Make sure that closed rooms have adequate ventilation.
- Use a dust extractor during work.

### 2.4.5 Poor physical condition

- Do not work under the influence of alcohol, drugs or medication.
- Do not work when overtired.

#### 2.4.6 Tool quality

- Do not use damaged grinding tools.
- Check grinding tools for damage before assembly.

#### 2.4.7 Danger from a grinding tool continuing to run in an accident

Make sure that the floor grinder can be stopped quickly.



## 3. Product description

## 3.1 Grinding system

The FGE400B floor grinder is used with matching TYROLIT components to form a grinding system.



#### Grinding system

- A Dust extractor
- B Floor grinder
- C Grinding tool

## 3.2 Intended use

The floor grinder has been designed and built for the following use:

- Only use the floor grinder for grinding, rough grinding and renovating floor coverings and other materials stated in this booklet or recommended by TYROLIT.
- Use the floor grinder solely with genuine tools and spare parts from TYROLIT. Otherwise, the CE marking and the warranty will lose their validity. Only use the floor grinder for dry work.



## 4.1 Design





### 4.1.1 Grinding head

The grinding head can be equipped with different grinding wheels. The dust protection cover together with the connected dust extractor ensure a good work environment. The housing ensures that the operator does not touch any rotating machine parts and minimises dust generation. Make sure that the housing is always in contact with the backing, so that no dust particles can be released.



Grinding head


## 4.2 Function

### 4.2.1 Functional description

The grinding disc with fitted grinding tools is driven by an electric motor. The electric motor is air-cooled. The floor grinder can be dismantled into two parts.

### 4.2.2 Two-piece floor grinder

The floor grinder can be dismantled into two parts for transport.

## 5 Assembly/Dismantling

## 5.1 Grinding tool



### DANGER

Risk of severe injury due to the floor grinder starting up unexpectedly.

- ► Switch off the floor grinder before working on the grinding disc.
- Disconnect the floor grinder from the mains supply.


#### INFORMATION

Always use a plastic mallet for mounting grinding tools. Metal hammers can damage the grinding tool and grinding disc.

#### 5.1.1 Assembly

 $\checkmark$  The tool and tool holder are clean.

Push the grinding tool into the tool holder.

• Secure the grinding tool in the tool holder with a few light taps of the plastic mallet.

#### 5.1.2 Dismantling

► To change the tool, detach the grinding tool with a few light taps of the rubber mallet. Then pull the grinding tool out of the holder.


## 5.2 Mounting the grinding disc

### DANGER

Risk of severe injury due to a floor grinder suddenly starting up or falling over.

- ► Switch off the floor grinder before working on the grinding disc.
- Disconnect the floor grinder from the mains supply.
- Make sure that nothing can get trapped or squashed when tilting the floor grinder.

### 5.2.1 Position of floor grinder




Machine position when mounting the grinding disc

Proceed as follows:

- $\checkmark$  Make sure the floor grinder is on a solid, horizontal, non-slip surface.
- Make sure that the connecting cable and dust extractor tube cannot be trapped.
- Move the handle unit (A) up to open.
- ► Tilt the floor grinder (B) backwards until you can access the grinding disc holders.


# 6 Operation

## 6.1 Controls

i

This section describes tool changes and operating the grinding machine. It does not deal with the technical aspects of grinding, such as the choice of grinding tools, machine guidance, etc.

You can find further information in the TYROLIT "Floor grinding safety manual".



Controls

- 1 Adjustable handle
- 2 Motor cable connection
- 3 Angle adjustment unit
- 4 Chassis handle
- 5 Carry handle (motor)
- 6 Adjustable wheel/axle
- 7 On/Off switch
- 8 EMERGENCY STOP
- 9 Handle lock


## 6.2 Adjusting the handle



#### DANGER Danger of crushing.

• Use both hands to adjust the handle.


The height of the handle can be adjusted without tools, enabling the floor grinder to be adapted for the individual user. When adjusting the handle, make sure that the handle lock engages correctly in the desired position.

## 6.3 Adjusting the angle

Using the angle adjustment unit, the floor grinder can be set to different work positions.




Work positions

## 6.4 Connections

### 6.4.1 Power supply



Power supply

- 1 Motor connection
- 2 Mains connection



#### INFORMATION

- The mains voltage must match the specifications on the type plate.
- Protect the connecting cables against heat, oil and sharp edges.
- Only use the connecting cables for their intended purpose.
- Do not use the connecting cable to pull the plug out of the socket.
- In the event of power failures: Switch off the floor grinder and pull out the plug.

### 6.4.2 Extension cables



## INFORMATION

- Only use approved and appropriately marked extension cables outdoors.
- Avoid the use of extension cables with multiple sockets and the simultaneous operation of several devices.

Only use extension cables that are approved for the field of application and with an adequate cable cross-section.

## 6.5 Extraction


Connect the dust extractor to the grinding machine. You can find information on connections in the documentation of the different TYROLIT dust extractor models.

## 6.6 Starting/switching off the floor grinder

### INFORMATION

Always determine the grinding area when starting work.



#### INFORMATION


You can find information on machine guidance, grinding techniques, etc. in the TYROLIT "Floor grinding safety manual".



#### DANGER

Non-compliance carries a risk of death or severe injury.

- Never work without suitable PPE.
- Always wear ear protection during work.
- Remove adjustment and assembly tools before switching on the floor grinder.
- Keep children away from the floor grinder and the work area.
- Avoid working in an unnatural posture. The inclination of the handle can be adjusted. When using the floor grinder manually, you can adjust it to achieve an optimum position.
- Ensure that you have a secure footing and keep your balance at all times.
- Avoid physical contact with earthed surfaces such as pipes, heaters, stoves and refrigerators. There is an increased risk of electric shock if your body is earthed.
- $\checkmark$  The work environment is dry.
- ✓ The dust extractor is correctly connected to the floor grinder.
- ✓ The floor grinder and dust extractor are correctly connected to the power supply.
- ✓ The EMERGENCY STOP is deactivated

## 7.2 High-pressure cleaning



### Caution

Cleaning with high-pressure cleaning systems can damage the floor grinder. Products containing solvents can damage the floor grinder and cable.

## 7.3 Recycling waste materials



TYROLIT floor grinders are manufactured using a high proportion of recyclable materials. A prerequisite for recycling is proper material separation. In many countries, TYROLIT has already set up arrangements for taking back your old devices for recycling. Ask TYROLIT Customer Service or your sales advisor.




